A Blueprint for Rural and Remote Schools

Rural and Remote Education: A blueprint for Action is a four-year plan focused on improving education for students in rural and remote areas, from early childhood through to post-secondary career planning. It will focus on: strengthening early childhood education, giving students access to a broad range of curriculum opportunities, particularly for gifted and talented students, providing new incentives for teachers and school leaders to teach in our school, support from a one-stop-shop specialist centre that offers coordinated inter-agency health and wellbeing services, advice and technology support to help us meet our student needs.

This announcement builds on other education reforms that have been introduced over the past two years such as Local Schools, Local Decisions. These reforms recognise that students and school communities are not all the same; they have different needs and require different levels of support.
