# **Communication Skills at Home**

# Ask Open Ended Questions

Open ended questions are when the answer can be a variety of things and not answered by "yes" or "no". These questions will teach your child how to think "hard" and reason for themselves.

Here are some examples of how to turn simple questions into open ended ones:

Question: Did you go to the store? Open Ended: Where did you go? Follow Up Question: What did you

Question: Was that book good?
Open Ended: What did you like about that book?

Follow Up Question: How would you change the book?

"Tell me about..." is a great phrase to use when focusing on language skills. Repeat Words Often

Especially when your children are young. They need to hear sounds and words at least 100 times before they will even start trying to say it. Don't limit how many times you say the same word.

In one of Dora the Explorer songs, they sing about her Map.

In one short song they say the word 12 times. Repetition is the key to learning...

...and it is how to improve communication skills.



Students asked numerous questions in relation to taking care of Jarva and how he came to join the Aro family.





# Canberra Excursion 2015

On October 27<sup>th</sup>, Stage 3 students travelled to Canberra for a 4 day excursion to experience a metropolitan area and to learn about government and the history of Australia.

The itinerary was bursting with many sites to visit and tours organised to guide us around the city. The Australian Institute of Sport inspired our athletic students to work hard and strive to achieve their dreams. The facilities were impressive and while we didn't see a well-known sports personality we did learn about some of the science behind the sports, particularly with swimming and the training pool. We experimented with various sports using simulators and game machines.

We made connections while in Canberra particularly the link with the Coo-ees of Gilgandra at the War Memorial and the Royal Australian Mint.

Our studies of how the government is formed, decisions are made and the history of the government was consolidated with our visit to Parliament House, the Democracy Educations Centre and the Electoral Education Centre. We experienced firsthand how preferential voting operates and will use this experience in class activities as decisions are needed to be made.

The connections between Gilgandra and Canberra was also made as a representative from our electorate took the time to come and speak to us, she opened up our eyes as she spoke about career opportunities within Parliament house.

All of the students were praised on many occasions by tour guides and various staff members at different locations for the manners and the respect they displayed while on their adventures around Canberra.

Overall the excursion was extremely successful and we are so pleased the school took the time to organise it for us. We appreciate our parents 'contribution in allowing us to attend.
