Year Two students and non-swimmers from Year 3-6 will be given a 30 minute group lesson, daily for ten days commencing from Monday 27th November to Friday 8th, December.

The lessons will be conducted from 12pm to 1:30pm at the pool. Students will be supervised by Margeaux Tindale; walking to and from the pool.

The cost for the School Swimming Scheme will be \$10 which includes pool entry for the ten days. The swimming scheme is subsidised by the Department of Education but does not include pool entry. Permission notes have been given out and need to be completed and returned with \$10.00 to the front office before Friday 24th November, 2017.

Remembrance Day

The memorial service held at the town cenotaph on Saturday to remember and pay respects to all those men and women who served in the armed forces was attended by our School Captain, Blair Keogh, and Prefect, Jack Chandler representing the school.

ANZAC Soil Project

Students from Gilgandra Public School, High School and local community members gathered on Friday at Curban Hall and Balladoran to remember all those who left this community to serve in World War 1.

A soil sample was taken from both groups and has been sent to Hyde Park where it will be incorporated into an Anzac War Memorial Wall representing the men and women from 1700 towns who fought for us.

This district had a strong involvement in World War 1, with men coming together from Curban, Gilgandra, Gulargambone, Collie, Tooraweenah, Breelong, Bearbung, Balladoran and Mendooran. Our soil sample and a plaque will be displayed as a public artwork in the Anzac Memorial in Hyde Park, Sydney.
