Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a Selective High School in 2021

Selective high schools cater for academically high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials.

Selective high schools are unzoned so parents can apply regardless of where they live. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 12 March 2020**. If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The application website opens at that link on 8 October 2019 and closes at 10pm on 11 November 2019. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 8 October 2019.

School attendance

Did you know that if your child misses as few as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed a whole year of education? By law, you are required to send your child to school every day. If your child has to be away from school for any reason, please either tell your child's teacher or send a signed note explaining the reason for the absence, as soon as possible. If your child arrives at school late, or needs to leave early, you will need to go to the office to sign your child in or out.

If you're having problems getting your child to attend school regularly and on time, please talk to your child's teacher or the principal.

School Uniform

Emergency Procedures

The Department of Education (DoE) require schools to undertake a mock exercise of their Emergency procedures every six months to ensure we are all aware of the requirements for staff, visitors and students. The school will conduct the mock exercise in either Week 5 or 6. If your child talks about the mock exercise please reassure them that it was a drill and DoE require us to undertake the training. The school will also reinforce this message.

Before School Care

Parents are reminded that the playground at Gilgandra Public School is supervised from 8:50am each morning. Teachers arrive early to prepare and organise for the day, before the first duty commences at 8:50am. We encourage parents to keep their children at home until 8:45am as there is minimal supervision provided.

Student Transport

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply *if* they:

are continuing at the same school are residing at the same address have *not* been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Redhill Excurson

Last Thursday Stage 2 students headed off to the Redhill Environmental Education Centre in Gulgong. The focus of the excursion was the 1870's gold rush. After students arrived and settled into their accommodation, they heard about the interesting history of Gulgong and how the gold rush began. Students learnt about the different people who came to strike it rich or set up businesses on the gold fields. The rest of the afternoon was spent playing colonial games such as sack races, quoits and egg and spoon races. Stage 2 then went on to making scones along with churning their own home-made butter from cream, which the students found very interesting. The next activity saw students dressing up and transporting themselves to school life in 1870. The teacher and the rules were both strict. The boys learnt about tying knots whilst the girls learnt to sew.

Lastly, students got to get their hands dirty by panning for their own gold. They learnt the proper techniques for panning, however, only seemed to find rocks.

The next morning, Stage 2 students woke up early for a walk up Flirtation Hill which had spectacular views of the entire town. The students were guided around town on a heritage walk learning about important historical places and events that occurred during the gold rush.

The last event on the excursion was a trip to the Pioneer Museum for a scavenger hunt. The museum contained thousands of antique items that showed students what everyday life would have been like for the miners and their families. Stage 2 and their teachers thoroughly enjoyed their excursion and represented our school beautifully. Stage 2 teachers - Amy, Caitlin and Mia
