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Dear Parents

The 2021 Young Leaders Program will involve selected Stage 3 student leaders in a Sustainability Action Plan that not only develops their self-confidence but also enhances the student's voice by building on connections within the school and other student school leaders. The students will complete a water and energy initiative that will contribute to their School Environmental Management Plan, informing Principals with strategies in which to improve and enhance their school environment. The program involves students attending a leadership camp (Wednesday, 4 May to Friday 6 May) and is supported by a series of three video conferences.

Cost:

The cost is \$150 per student, which includes all meals, activities and NPWS camping fees. **This will be covered by the school.**

Travel:

The students will be departing from school on Wednesday, 4 May and returning on Friday, 6 May after lunch.

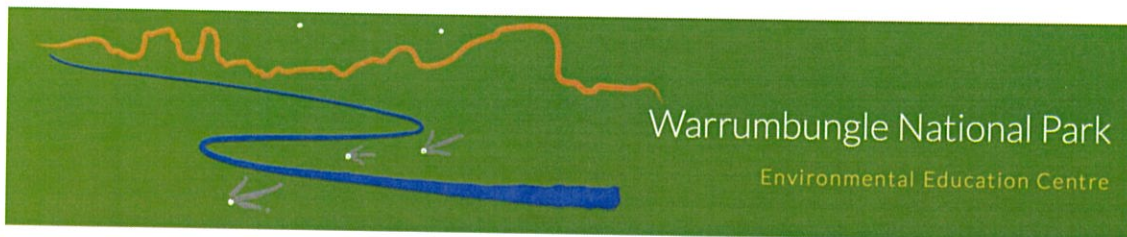
